

The 500th anniversary of the publication of Martin Luther's Ninety-Five Theses in 1517

is the perfect time of year to reflect on the gospel of grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone. Is the Protestant Reformation over? Why was the priesthood of all believers



such an important truth to Martin Luther? What did Luther mean when he said, "My conscience is captive to the Word of God. Thus I cannot and will not recant, for going against conscience is neither safe nor salutary. I can do no other, here I stand, God help me."

Join us in church on Sabbath NOV 4 as we take a closer look at the timely and powerful truths both Luther and the Reformation emphasized that still shape our thinking as Christians today. ##



For KING & COUNTRY is a Christian duo composed of Australian brothers Joel (born 5 June 1984) and Luke Smallbone (born 22 October 1986). They describe their philosophy as such:

"The power of music can impact our mood, emotions, our day. But when you merge the strength of music with the heart, hope and passion of the Gospel...it has the ultimate power not only to change someone's day, but to impact them for eternity. This is why we write music and sing songs - we hope that people will be moved, encouraged and stirred to live a life for Someone greater than themselves."

Committed to combating human trafficking, Joel Smallbone was the lead actor in a 2016 drama about human trafficking entitled *Priceless*, which was released in theaters in October 2016. Luke was one of the producers (together with their father) and their brother Ben directed the movie. Some of the music for the film was written by For King & Country. In 2015, they won two Grammy Awards at the 57th Grammy Awards, one for Best Contemporary Christian Music Album and one for Best Contemporary Christian Music Performance/Song.

This year, they will be the featured guests at the '6th Annual Smile for Freedom' show at the Stranahan Theater on Friday, October 27, 2017 at 7 pm and once again, Toledo First is partnering with The Daughter Project providing both tickets to TF members while supplies last (see Ron Szczechowski or Pastor Mike) and volunteers to help unload

and load the trucks with the band's equipment and instruments. 100% of the ticket sales are donated to *The*
